## **USING MEDICINES SAFELY**



Modern medicine has made our lives better in many ways. It has helped us live longer, healthier lives. But people over 65

have to be careful when taking medications, especially when they're taking many different drugs.

Whenever a new drug is prescribed, tell your doctor about all the medicines you take. Remind your doctor about your allergies and any problems you have had with medicines. Understand how to take the medicine before you start using it. The following is a list of questions to ask your doctor about a new medicine.

- What is the name of the medicine, and why am I taking it?
- How many times a day should I take it? At what times? If the bottle says take "4 times a day," does that mean 4 times in 24 hours or 4 times during the daytime?
- Should I take the medicine with food or without? Is there anything I should not eat or drink when taking this medicine?
- What does "as needed" mean?
- When should I stop taking the medicine?
- If I forget to take my medicine, what should I do?
- What side effects can I expect? What should I do if I have a problem?

Using a memory aid will help you to take medicines on time. Some people use meals or bedtime as reminders to take their medicine. Other people use charts, calendars, and weekly pill boxes. Find a system that works for you.
