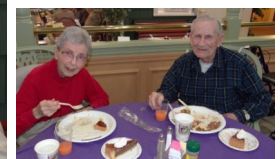
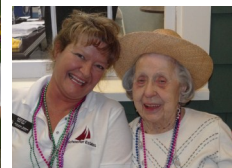
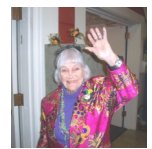
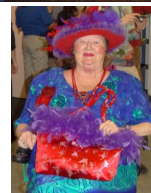
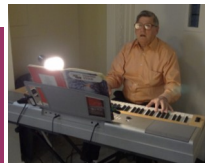
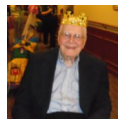
MARDI GRAS 2012 REVIEW!
