How Long Have Candy Canes Been Around For?

The first record of candy canes in America goes all the way back to 1847 when a German immigrant used them to decorate his holiday tree, according to the [National Confectioners Association](#). (Prior to that, legend says they were invented in 1670 by a choirmaster in Cologne, Germany.) Nowadays, the iconic [Christmas candy](#) is a holiday staple with more than 1.2 billion produced and sold each year.
