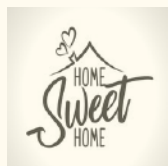
## It's Mardi Gras Time!

### Beware of S C A M ' S

It seems like scam's never go away. Bad people can take advantage of you. Below are just a few of the ways. Never give out your information to a stranger!!

Charity scams - Fake charities pop up during disasters. And scammers can also claim to be from real charities.

Checks from the government - Scammers say they're from the IRS or another government agency and ask for your personal information or try to charge you fake fees for getting your stimulus check or offer you a way to get the money early.

Grandparent and military service member scams - A scammer pretends to be a grandchild or a military service member who's sick or in trouble because of the coronavirus. They contact you asking to wire them money to pay for fake medical or travel expenses. Just hang up. Be alert, be aware.
